Consequently, the course guide has been updated to reflect the changes in the text. While insurance accounting as whole has not changed significantly, there are details that have changed extensively throughout the course. <p>AMIM 121</p>	<p>One of the AMIM 121 texts, <i>The Business of Shipping</i>, published by Cornell Maritime Press, has been revised to add a new chapter on maritime security and update other parts of the book. The course guide has been revised to reflect the new material, to reword some educational objectives relating to the new text, and to omit some nonessential portions of <i>The Business of Shipping</i> from the required reading to make the assignments more manageable for busy learners. Students are required to purchase the new study materials to be prepared for the examination. <p>CPCU 560</p>	<p>The CPCU 560 text, <i>Financial Markets and Institutions</i>, published by McGraw-Hill, has undergone a minor revision. Of particular note, assignment 5 is chapter 8 in the new text. Chapters 17 and 18 have had educational objectives re-ordered or some new ones added. Some chapters have had the content re-ordered even though it remains the same. Obviously, page numbers between the editions are different. Students who have the 3rd edition of the text and 6th edition of the course guide may still use them for the exam.
